## Chapter 28

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1.	On page 262, Hamilton states, "Jewish and Christian fundamentalists who purport to take the Bible literally still pick and choose what they will follow." Did this revelation surprise you? Why or why not?	
2.	Give an example of a teaching or practice in the bible that we don't follow now. Why do you believe we don't practice it now?	
3.	What does Hamilton says we should ask ourselves when deciding what teachings of the bible reflect God's will for us today? (see page 264)	
Chapter 29		
1.	Hamilton states that Genesis 19 says nothing about loving, committed homosexual relationships. What does he think was the evil the men of Sodom were attempting to commit?	
2.	What did Hamilton say may be another reason why Moses said what he did in Leviticus 20:13?	
3.	Name something that was considered unclean or abnormal in the past (or in the bible – see the book of Leviticus for examples) that we don't think is abnormal now.	
4.	On pages 270 and 271, Hamilton suggests that Paul had three things in mind when he wrote Romans 1:26-27. Name one of them.	

5.	On page 272, Hamilton names "three biblical teachings that many question today." What are they?
6.	Hamilton describes three "buckets" or categories we can place the different teachings of scripture. What are they? Do you agree with him?
7.	Have you ever experienced something that made you question a teaching in the bible? If yes, please describe.
